

PhD Field Examinations

Decorative Arts, Design History, Material Culture

The field examinations are intended to ensure that the student acquires a broad knowledge of three distinct fields. The student may select three fields from the list below (provided that there is no significant overlap in chronology or content), or alternatively choose two fields from the list and, as a third field, opt for an area of individual interest ("Wildcard"). Ordinarily this field of study would cover no less than 50 years in an area likely to be related to the candidate's dissertation topic. This field is subject to approval by the Graduate Committee (description and preliminary bibliography required).
